Women's Med Center has Second Emergency Call in 4 Weeks

{Dayton, Ohio} Dayton Right to Life is reporting that the Women's Med Center, the area's largest abortion facility, has had its 2nd 911 call in 4 weeks. The first 911 call came on February 7, 2019. The injured woman on that day would not stop "seizing" according to the call. Emergency transportation by the City of Kettering had to be provided to Miami Valley Hospital. Then again on March 7, 2019 at approximately 11am yet another woman had to be transported for "hemorrhaging." The city of Kettering once again providing transportation to Miami Valley Hospital.

**Coincidentally, this abortion facility will be in court tomorrow March 12th to argue its license revocation. The 2nd district court of Appeals will be hearing its latest appeal at 10:30am tomorrow morning.

The Ohio Department of Health revoked this facility's license in 2016. It has been on appeal since that date. Judge Mary Wiseman approved a "stay" for this facility to stay open while under appeal.

"The reckless actions of this so-called 'healthcare' facility continues to harm women," says Margie Christie, Executive Director, Dayton

Right to Life. "In just the last 3 years, this facility has had four 9-1-1 calls and has been investigated by the State of Ohio for treating a patient without consent. It is time for this community to speak up and say 'enough is enough.'"
