## Unborn Heartbeat Amendment Passes in Ohio Senate!

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE, December 6, 2016 (Dayton, Ohio)

The Ohio General Assembly has been quite busy as of late, as they wrap up their year-end session. Today's business is of great significance for the pro-life community.

Today the Ohio Senate added Ohio's Unborn Heartbeat Protection bill, which has been before the legislature for several years, as an amendment to House Bill 493 child abuse reporting law. The Senate has approved H.B. 493 with Heartbeat protection amendment 21-10.

Ohio's Unborn Heartbeat Protection bill protects unborn babies with a detectable heartbeat from abortion, as early as six weeks gestation.

H.B. 493 with Heartbeat protection amendment now goes to the Ohio House of Representatives for concurrence - *which could be as early as today* - then if approved, to Governor Kasich for signature.

Dayton Right to Life, along with pro-life organizations across the State of Ohio, congratulate the Ohio Senate on this momentous vote that will save hundreds, if not thousands, of preborn children in our State. "Life must be protected from conception to natural death. We, and other organizations across Ohio, will continue to work together and be voice for the voiceless," says Margie Christie, Assistant Executive Director of Dayton Right to Life.
