In September, approximately a week or so before our gala, Dayton Right to Life was informed by our landlord, the Life Enrichment Center, that they were no longer able to operate our building. Higher energy costs, recent vandalism, and the maintenance of a 100-year-old building were cited as the reason for the closure.

This news is devastating for the families we serve. Each week, at least 50 families come to our pantry for emergency assistance with diapers, formula, clothes, and other supplies. It is imperative that we continue these services as best we can.

Our board has taken on the task of finding us a new location. As you can imagine, the costs associated with a new location are immense, and frankly, intimidating. But I know our new location will be exactly where God wants us to be, and so He will lead and guide us with this project.

On behalf of our board and staff, I am asking for your support. We have established a campaign entitled, "Building Our Future," specifically for our new home.
